

# Year 4 Summer Term Newsletter

This letter explains what your child will be learning during this term and how you may be able to help them at home.

Topics taught in Year 4 are planned to meet the subject guidance of the National Curriculum.



This term, our learning is based around the big question, “An Atlas of Britain: What’s on the Map?” The children will be learning about maps and developing reading skills. They will be producing a range of work that shows their geographical awareness of the United Kingdom. In computing, the children will be creating a database of UK landmarks, allowing them to compare each of the landmarks. In RE, as well as learning about major festivals from a wealth of different world religions during assemblies, we will be focusing on Islam and the Prophet Muhammad. During science, we will be looking at teeth, healthy eating and classifying and grouping living things through the use of keys.

## How you can help.

Please hear your child read at least once a week and sign their reading record.

Please ensure homework is handed in on time.

We will be completing the end of Year 4 times table assessment this term, where the expectation is that the children know all of their times tables up to and including 12x12. Your support with times tables practise will be much appreciated. We strongly recommend this site, which is in a similar format to the assessment.
