

How do they compare?

Year 2– India Topic

This term your child will experience what India and its culture has to offer. We will be researching the similarities and differences between the villages and cities in India and England. Your child will learn how to locate countries and continents on a map.

English / Maths

On the reverse please find attached a list of genres your child will cover over the term in English and Maths.

Science

Children will be learning about living things and their habitats and how we can work out what's alive and what's not? We will collect specimens and sort them into categories as well as investigate habitats and food chains. Your child will also be working scientifically and carrying out various experiments.

Geography

Children will be learning to use atlases and maps to locate geographical physical and human features of India. They will also develop an understanding of the diverse culture of India and compare these to our culture and geography in the U.K.

Creative

The sports coaches are in on Fridays to deliver PE, your child will also take part in P.E on a Thursday afternoon. As part of their creative afternoons children will be focussing on ways of travelling in gymnastics, including twisting, spinning and turning.

ICT

Your child will create an eBook and a PowerPoint presentation during their computing sessions.

Art

In art your child will learn about the work of Nandalal Bose and they will then create a collage depicting elements of Indian culture that have captivated and inspired them.

Music

In music children will listen to and appraise music. They will use examples to create their own animal themed composition.

RE

In RE children will be exploring Holy Places and will develop their knowledge and understanding of key features within a Christian church and a Hindu mandir.
